
GLAMOUR: At least you know something about someone before you have a drink.

GLAMOUR: Do you fund-raise for Obama?

MK: More like street-art-based stuff in Los Angeles that I can't talk about...because I'm pretty sure it's illegal.

GLAMOUR: You graffiti?

MK: Mm-hmm. I'd rather do that. I don't need attention for it. What I truly believe in I will do privately.

GLAMOUR: But you're not a private person anymore—your profile has risen so much since Black Swan. Are you happy with the roles you're getting offered now?

MK: After Forgetting Sarah Marshall, I could have done so many romantic comedies. It's so easy to take an actress, more so than an actor, and make her be the pretty girl or the serious actress or the character actress. You have three categories that they like to put you in, and that's it. I knew I could do so many other things; I just had so much more to prove to people. And to myself. I didn't want to do romantic comedies for the rest of my life, and now I don't have to.

GLAMOUR: In Ted, you costar with Mark Wahlberg. He's more than a decade older than you. Is that age gap odd to you?

MK: Well, now I'm playing opposite Clive Owen! He's 47, maybe. I think that male actors are allowed to get older and female actors are not. So you have your 40-year-old guys being paired with a twentysomething woman. The documentary Searching for Debra Winger is the best thing that explains it.

GLAMOUR: You've been linked to many men in the tabloids. I saw you recently said the Ashton Kutcher thing was absurd....

MK: Ninety-nine percent of it is bulls--t. That is the biggest form of bullying ever, the paparazzi. Printing lies, making accusations, it's just bullying.

GLAMOUR: Your body was talked about so much during the wave of press for Black Swan, in which you played a rail-thin ballerina. How do you feel now?

MK: This is my normal body. It's not 98 pounds. God, I'm probably 25 pounds heavier in muscle mass and weight at this point. What was crazy was, when I was shooting Black Swan, everyone was like, "Gosh, you're really too skinny." Then my weight started bouncing back and they're like, "She looked better when she was anorexic-looking." You can't please anyone! It was just for work. I didn't do it because I had issues. Now this is my normal weight that I started out with.

GLAMOUR: How did your body feel 25 pounds lighter?

MK: Flat, flat, flat. [She gestures to her chest and hips.] There was no shape, no form, nothing, nothing.

GLAMOUR: In 2011 a company ranked the most dangerous computer viruses, and one of them was named Mila Kunis. So when teenage boys would search for Mila Kunis pictures, a virus would steal their personal information and crash their hard drives. You really have gone viral!

MK: Who knew? That poor 14-year-old kid That's really funny. I don't know what to say to that. I apologize to anybody who googled me and then had their credit

card number stolen. I apologize.
